GENERAL RULES

The BudaSkate Cup 2023 will be conducted in accordance with the current ISU Constitution, ISU General Regulations and Special Regulations & Technical Rules for Synchronized Skating as well as all pertinent ISU Communications and the Technical Requirements for ISU Adult Figure Skating Competitions for season 2022-2023.

The teams must belong to an ISU Member. All skaters must qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 108, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in this Announcement and they meet the participation requirements.

All programs will be judged in accordance with ISU Com. 2471, Com. 2501, Com. 2486, Com. 2487 and Com. 2491. The categories Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile and Non ISU Basic Novice coincides with the category ISU Basic Novice. The Requirements for the Adult category coincides with the ISU Adult Figure Skating Competitions for season 2022-2023. In case of changes, the current ISU Communication will always apply.

FIGURE SKATING

GENERAL RULES

The BudaSkate Spring Cup 2023 Interclub Competition in Figure Skating will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2022, the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2022, and the relevant ISU Communications.

All Members of the ISU and Clubs being members of National Skating Federations associated with the ISU, are invited to take part in the competition. Participation at BudaSkate Spring Cup is open to all competitors who belong to an ISU Member, and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 a) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2030 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 2030 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate. Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.

SYNCHRONIZED SKATING

Technical requirements INTERCLUB – CATEGORY:

Age requirements: 80% of the Team must fulfill the age requirement that corresponds to the category. For the other 20% a permissible age deviation of +/-2 years is permitted for Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile and Non ISU Basic Novice, a permissible age deviation of -3 years is permitted for Adult. 50% of the skaters can be overlapped if you have more teams competing.

The 80% / 20% rule applies according to the number of Skaters of a team stated in the team entry:

Mini:

shall consist of 6-16 skaters with a maximum number of 4 (four) alternate skaters. Before 1st July 2022 the skaters must have not reached the age of 10.

80% of the team didn't compete in the previous season in any other SYS category than Mini.

Ice coverage requirement is maximum 50% of the rink. Ice coverage requirement of the required elements is also proportionally smaller. Free skating program 2.00 min (+/- 10 sec)
5 elements are obligatory: elements: block, line, circle, wheel, intersection/moves

The Program Components Factor is 2.67

Max call level 2.

Pre Juvenile:

shall consist of 8-16 skaters with a maximum number of 4 (four) alternate skaters. Before 1st July 2022 the skaters must have not reached the age of 11. Free skating program 3.00 min (+/- 10 sec)

The Program Components Factor is 2.67

Max call level 2.

Juvenile:

shall consist of 8 -16 skaters with a maximum number of 4 (four) alternate skaters Before 1st July 2022 the skaters must have not reached the age of 13. Free skating program: 3.00 min (+/- 10 sec)

The Program Components Factor is 2.67

Max call level 2.

Non ISU Basic Novice:

shall consist of 8 -16 Skaters with a maximum number of 4 (four) alternate Skaters. Before 1st July 2022 the skaters must have reached the age of 10 and have not reached the age of 15. Free skating program: 3.00 min (+ / - 10 sec) The Program

Components Factor is 2.67

Max call level 3.

Mixed Age:

shall consist of 8 -16 skaters with a maximum number of 4 (four) alternate Skaters, no age limit. According to the ISU Communication No. 2471 the Mixed Age category follows the general rules for the Junior category and for illegal elements follow the novice category. Free skating program: 3:30 +/- 10 sec

The Program Components Factor is 2.67.

Max call level 3.

Adult:

shall consist of 8-16 skaters with a maximum number of 4 (four) alternate skaters. Before 1st July 2022 the skaters must have reached the age of 18.

Free skating program: 3.00 min (+ / - 10 sec)

Program Components Factor is 1.67

Max call level 3.

Technical requirements ISU – CATEGORY:**Basic Novice:**

shall consist of 12-16 Skaters with a maximum number of 4 (four) alternate skaters. Before 1st July 2022 all of them must have reached at least the age of 10 but have not reached the age of 15.

Free Skating program: 3.00 min (+ / - 10 sec)

Program Components Factor is 2.67

If an injury/illness should occur during official practice or during Competition, the team will be permitted to skate with not less than 11 Skaters.

Junior:

shall consist of 12-16 Skaters with a maximum number of 4 (four) alternate skaters. Before 1st July 2022 all of them must have reached at least the age of 13 but have not reached the age of 19.

Short Program: 2.50 min (but may be less),

Program Components Factor is 1.33

Free Skating program: 3.30 min (+ / - 10 sec)

Program Components Factor is 2.67

If an injury/illness should occur during official practice or during Competition, the Team will be permitted to skate with not less than 11 Skaters.

Senior:

shall consist of 16 skaters with a maximum number of 4 (four) alternate skaters. Before 1st July 2022 all of them must have reached at least the age of 16.

If an injury/illness should occur during official practice or during Competition, the Team will be permitted to skate with not less than 14 Skaters.

Short Program: 2.50 min (but may be less)

Program Components Factor is 1.33

Free Skating program: 4.00 min (+ / - 10 sec)

Program Components Factor is 2.67

FIGURE SKATING

Technical requirements

CHICKS GIRLS and BOYS (Born after 1st of July 2014 - Before 30th of June 2015) MINI CHICKS GIRLS and BOYS (Born after 1st of July 2015)

Free Skating Duration: 2'00 min. +/- 10 sec.

a) Maximum of 4 jump elements for Girls and Boys, and one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. A jump sequence consists of 2 (two) jumps of any number of revolutions, beginning with any jump, immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump. A jump combination can contain only two jumps. Only two jumps with 1, 1 ½, 2 or 2 ½ revolutions can be repeated once. Triple jumps are not permitted.

b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total) and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Flying entry is allowed in both spins.

c) There must be a maximum: One (1) choreo sequence with one spiral position with 3 sec. and one step sequence ½ utilizing the ice surface. The choreo sequence will have a fixed Base value and be evaluated in GOE only.

d) In case of fall the deduction will be -0,5 by the Technical Panel

The Program Components are only judged in:

- Skating Skills
- Performance

The factors of the Program Components are Boys 2.5 Girls 2.5

Levels explanations For Chicks ISU 7 and younger Singles, in all elements, which are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

CUBS GIRLS and BOYS (Born after 1st of July 2012 – Before 30th of June 2013) MINI CUBS GIRLS and BOYS (Born after 1st of July 2013 - Before 30th of June 2014) Free

Skating Duration: 2'30 min. +/- 10 sec.

a) Maximum of 5 jump elements for Girls and Boys, and one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. A jump sequence consists of 2 (two) jumps of any number of revolutions, beginning with any jump, immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump. Jump combinations can contain only two jumps. Only two jumps with 1, 1 ½, 2 or 2 ½ revolutions can be repeated once. Triple jumps are not permitted.

b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total) and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Flying entry is allowed in both spins.

c) There must be a maximum of one (1) step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.

d) In case of fall the deduction will be -0,5 by the Technical Panel.

The Program Components are only judged in:

- Skating Skills
- Performance/Execution

The factors of the Program Components are Boys 2.5 Girls 2.5

Levels explanations For Cubs and Mini Cubs Singles, in all elements, which are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

BASIC NOVICE GIRLS and BOYS

according to ISU Communication No.2489 and subsequent updates.

Free Skating Duration: 2:30 min +/- 10 sec.

INTERMEDIATE NOVICE GIRLS and BOYS

according to ISU Communication No. 2489 and subsequent updates.

Free Skating Duration: 3 min +/- 10 sec.

ADVANCED NOVICE FIGURE SKATING

according to ISU Communication No. 2489 and subsequent updates.

Short program 2:20 +/-Free Skating Duration: 3 min +/- 10 sec.

Judges and Officials:

Each participating country may enter one judge. Additional judges can be invited. The Referees, Technical Specialists, Technical Controllers, Data and Replay Operators will be nominated by the Organizing Committee.

Please send your recommendations to the OC until 6th February.

Final judges and technical panel will be appointed by the MOKSZ - Hungarian Skating Federation Officials Committee.

Awards:

The podium finishers will receive a medal.

Schedule:

The schedule of the competition will be available and announced based on the entries received after the entry deadline.

Draw:

electronic draw will be done before the short program and reverse order after the short program in ISU categories

Electronic draw will be done before the free skating program in club categories.

The music can only be submitted electronically by sending it to the email address info@budaskate.hu .

The Organizing Committee (OC) reserves the right to cancel the competition after the closing of the final entry, if restrictions imposed by the public health departments or governmental regulations to contain the spread of the Covid-19 virus prohibit the competition from taking place or make the execution untenable. In case thereof, the OC will refund 90 percent of the entry fee.

Please use our **Preliminary Entry Form** for the preliminary entry. Preliminary Entries, indicating participation of the ISU Member (or club), have to be submitted no later than **3rd February 2023**.

The organizer of the competition does not assume any responsibility. The teams and every skater acknowledges and consents to the fact that a video and audio recording is made of him/her.

Together with the entry, the teams and skaters expressly consents to the processing of his personal data necessary for the entry by BudaSkate SE. The purpose of data management is to register in the competition system and to administer the results achieved in the competition. BudaSkate SE handles the data provided with the entry in accordance with the applicable legislation, so in particular in accordance with the provisions of the GDPR, the data may be forwarded to MOKSZ - Hungarian Skating Federation, the purpose of the data transmission is to provide information and collect statistical data. BudaSkate SE does not use a data processor.

BudaSkate SE provides medical care (foot guard) during the competition.
